I am happy and delighted to get a time to give the PowerPoint presentation on behalf of MADDC to highlight an achievements and functions of two and half years of the present term of 11<sup>th</sup> MADDC. Since a very short time I will try my best to highlight as much as possible and concluded within the stipulated time.

# BACKGROUND OF MADC

- ▶ In 1947, Govt. of India set up Sub-Committee of the Constituent Assembly name NEF(Assam) Tribal and Excluded Area Committee under the Chairmanship of Gopinath Bordoloi, the then Chief Minister of Assam.
- ▶ As per the recommendation of the said sub- Committee, Pawi-Lakher Regional Council was constituted Vide Notification No. TAD/R/50/119 of 31.07.1951 incorporated into Article 244(2) and 275(1) called sixth schedule to the constitution,
- ▶ Through the North East Area (Re-Organisation) 1971, the Mizo Hills District council was elevated to the status of Union Territory
- ▶ Following this, PLRC was dissolved and trifurcated into 3 ADCs i.e. LADC, PADC & CADC
- ▶ Later LADC and PADC were renamed as MADC and LADC through Amendment of sixth Scheduled to the Constitution of India in 1988.

# OBJECTIVE FOR FORMATION OF MADC

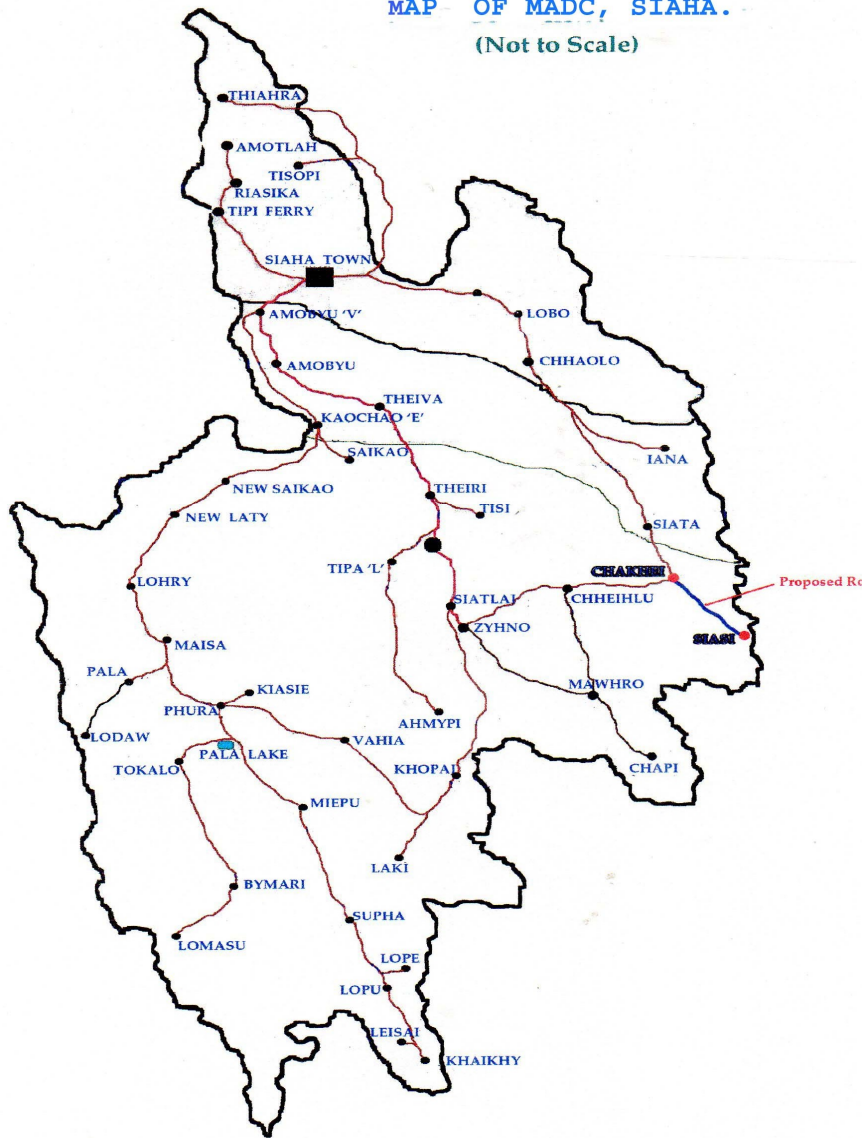
- ▶ Under Article 244(2) and 275(1) of the Constitution, the provision of the Sixth Schedule had applied Tribal Areas in Mizoram
- ▶ The philosophy behind the Sixth Schedule to the Constitution of India is to protect and develop the Tribal's Custom and Traditions, Languages, their Population, interest and develop themselves by Constitutionally mandating a special kind of Autonomous governance
- ▶ The Sixth Schedule endows these Councils with extensive Legislative, Judicial, Executive, and Financial Powers

# POWERS OF MADC

- ▶ The Sixth Schedule to the Constitution of India, Paragraph 3, 6, 8 and 10 provides a limited powers to the Autonomous District Councils
- ▶ Knowing these limited powers of ADCs, His Excellency The Governor of Mizoram entrusted 20 Departments as provided by paragraph 6(2) of the sixth schedule to ADCs conditionally and unconditionally through the Notification dated 2<sup>nd</sup> Sept. 1993 and modified the earlier Notification dated 20<sup>th</sup> Aug. 1998 and further modified in 2011.

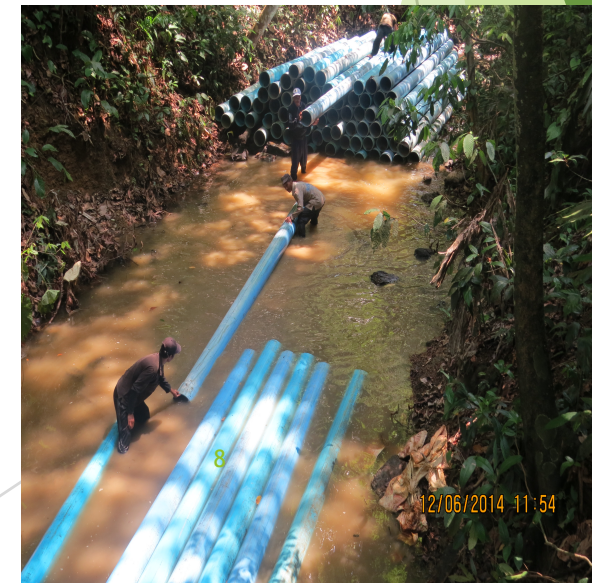

# PROPOSAL FOR POTENTIAL REVENUE GENERATION

- ▶ Development of Potential Eco-Tourism Spots
- ▶ Construction of Multi Level Parking Centres
- ▶ Promotion of Weaving Centre (*Weaving Centre Building was completed, as of now every effort is made for procuring Equipment & Materials*)
- ▶ Anticipated Revenue from Mini Hydel Power at Pala Lake (On-Going - 70% completed)





# ROLE OF RESPONSIBILITY

- ▶ The MADC also introduced RTI Acts, 2005 and instituted RTI Cell within MADC to provide information related to working and functioning of MADC to whomever who sought it through proper Official Channels
- ▶ Creation of MADC Website ([www.madconline.com](http://www.madconline.com)) to provide easy access of Digital Information related to MADC. Moreover, a dedicated Local Cable TV Channel to broadcast various activities of MADC to the public masses.
- ▶ Regular monitoring and Auditing is being carried out regularly by outside Government Agencies to ensure transparency and responsibility
- ▶ Grass-root level Training is being conducted frequently for Village Council Members to ensure proper usage of Funds, Village Administration, Village Health Sanitation and work executions.
- ▶ To ensure Democratic participation at Grass-Root level, Village Level Assembly (Gram Sabha) is stipulated in MADC Village Council Acts, 2011
- ▶ Reservation for Women in each and every Village Council is mandatory.
- ▶ Incumbency period of Village Council Members has been increased from 3 to 5 years

# EDUCATION & HUMAN RESOURCES SECTOR

The MADC has been constantly giving top priority into the development of Education and Human Resources Development since its inception. Here are a few notable achievements worth mentioned below:

- ▶ With the introduction of RTE Act, 2009 by GOI, the MADC has also implemented this Act accordingly since 2010 till date.
- ▶ Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) has also been implemented by giving Compulsory required Training to all the Teachers under its wing.
- ▶ 26 Private Schools were upgraded to Lump sum Grant-in-Aid status funded from Revenue Receipt recently
- ▶ As per NCERT direction, Mass Training of D.El.Ed to all Primary and Middle School Teachers has been imparted under IGNOU and DIET, Mizoram
- ▶ 11 Nos of School Buildings were completed under SPA Fund with an amount of ₹ 405.00 Lakhs and 7 Nos of School Buildings from One Time Grant through Niti Aayog with an amount of ₹ 92.00 Lakhs

# PROMOTION OF HINDI IN MADC

- ▶ Orientation Training for Hindi Teachers were held 5 times in Siaha. For these Training, Resources Persons came from Regional Director, Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Shillong
- ▶ All the Hindi Teachers have undergone mandatory Training
- ▶ All the UPS Schools were provided with Hindi Teachers. But unfortunately these Teachers' Services were discontinued by the GOI since last year.
- ▶ For the promotion of Hindi Language, permission to establish 1 Hindi College and 1 Hindi School were granted within MADC Area, and the Institutions are being run by competent faculty with high success rate.
- ▶ At least 1 Seminar is being organised each year for promotion of Hindi Language.

## AGRI & ALLIED SECTOR

- ▶ In order to boost Agriculture products, development of Wet Rice Cultivations covering 150 Hacs and Hill Terracing of 75 Hacs
- ▶ Materials and Technical assistance are given to the Farmers
- ▶ One time grand in aid were given to selected families for Fisheries Development, Piggery, Poultry and Goat Rearing.
- ▶ MADC maintains one of the best Road side plantation in all of Mizoram. Under national Afforestation programme, 2890 ha of plantation have been created and maintained.
- ▶ The on going project of Mini-hydro project near Lake Pala is envisioned to provide Electricity to nearby villages and helps in irrigation purposes.
- ▶ 150 hac of Rubber plantation at River Ka-ao is being maintained by the Soil Department of MADC.
- ▶ Revenue Generation from MADC Dairy & Poultry farm has seen increases in year on year basis.

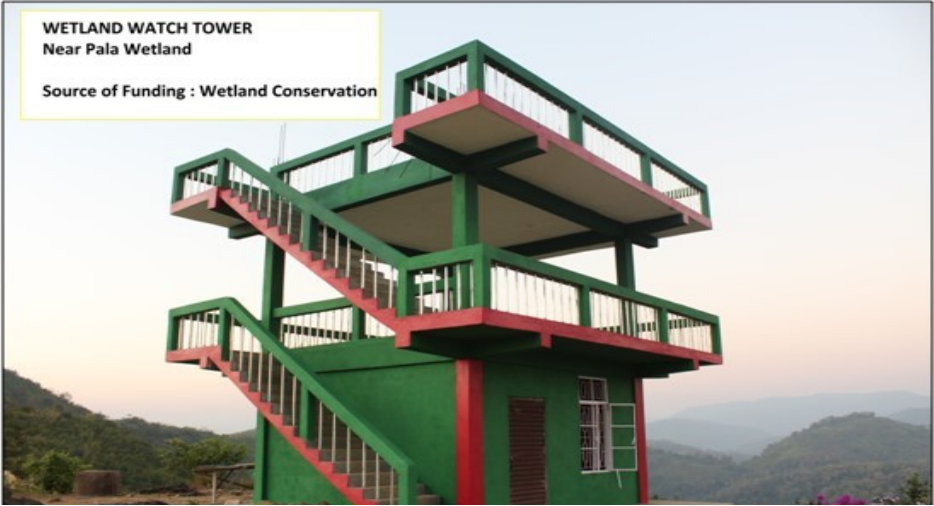
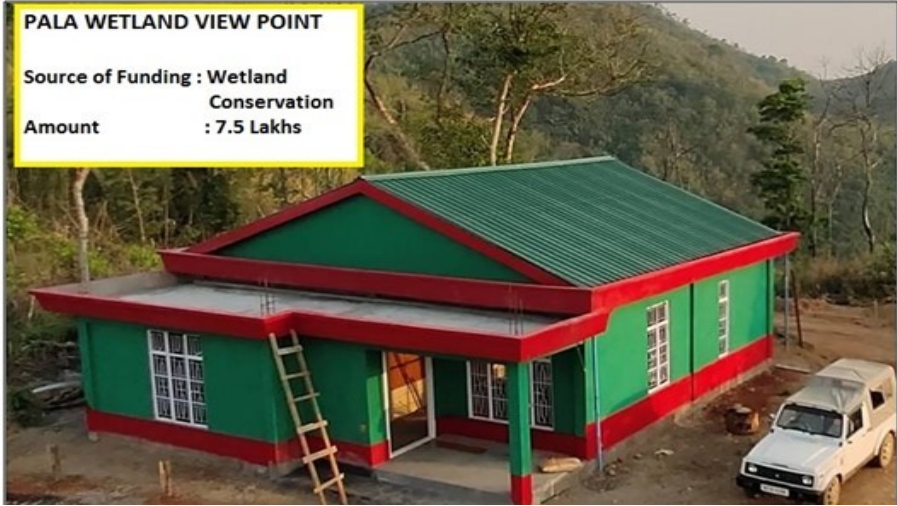




Figure 2 Tisopi P/S-II Rs.6:00 Lakhs, NITI Ayog Fund

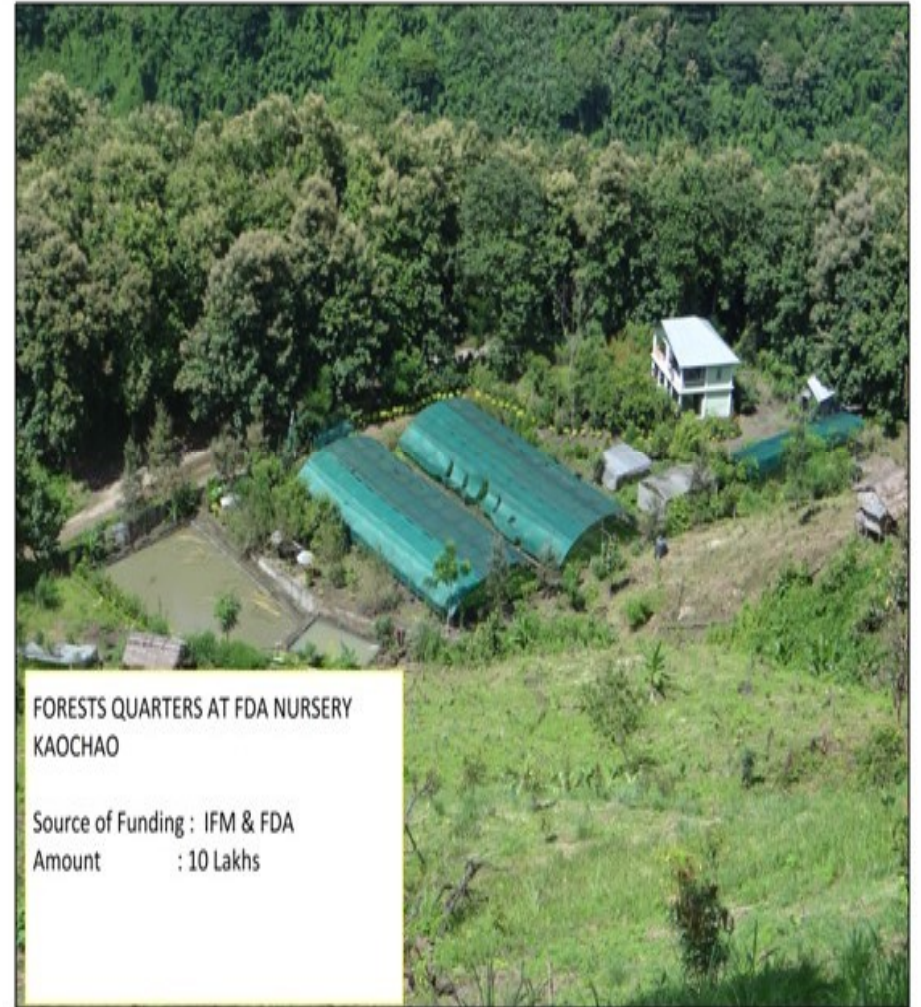
